OHIO PAINT HORSE CLUB BY-LAWS AND CODE OF REGULATIONS

*Rule changes revised as of General Membership Meeting, November 11, 2006, Delaware, Ohio
By-Laws reviewed and updated by the Board of Trustees, December 2, 2006, Huber Heights, Ohio
By-Laws reviewed and updated by the Board of Trustees, December 29, 2007
Lima, Ohio*

1. NAME: Ohio Paint Horse Club, Inc., a non-profit organization.
2. A. Place of business shall be the address of the duly-elected secretary.
B. Boundary shall include the State of Ohio and all official eighty-eight (88) counties.
3. PURPOSES: To create, stimulate and promote interest in the breeding, riding and showing of the Paint Horse in the State of Ohio. To at all times promote the upgrading of the Paint Horse. To improve the breed in this State. To promote and hold horse shows, participate in horse shows, hold trail rides and other activities. To promote and create interest in the Paint Horse and to do any and all things necessary or incident to the accomplishment of such purposes.
4. MEETINGS:
 - A. ANNUAL MEETING: The annual meeting of the membership of this corporation shall be held in November or December of each year at such place as agreed upon by a majority of the Board of Trustees. Meetings of this organization shall be held at such time and place as agreed upon by a majority of the Board of Trustees with a minimum of one meeting per year. Notice of same shall be sent to all members by the Secretary. Special meetings of the general membership may be called by a notice signed by not less than ten percent of the adult members; adult to be individual, family or organizational member, then in good standing. Notice of meeting indicating briefly the subject or object thereof shall be given in the same manner as provided with respect to notice of annual meeting.
 - C. TRUSTEE MEETINGS: There shall be a *six (6)* meeting of the Trustees *per year* with the time and place to be determined by the *President*.
 - D. SPECIAL MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES: May be called by President, Vice President or by a majority of members of Board of Trustees. Notify by mail ten days before meeting.
 - E. NOTICE OF MEETINGS: Notice of annual, special and other meetings shall be given to the members by the Secretary by either posting in the Newsletter *and or on* OPHC Website thirty days before such meeting. Notice for special meetings of the Trustees is ten days prior.
5. MEMBERSHIPS AND DUES
 - A. Any person having a bona fide interest in Paint Horses may apply for membership.
 - B. The following types of memberships are available:
 1. INDIVIDUAL MEMBERSHIP: For any person nineteen (19) years of age or older as of January 1. Such person is eligible to vote and to be a Director/Trustee.
 2. YOUTH MEMBERSHIP: For any person eighteen (18) years of age and under as of January 1. Must have written consent of a Parent or Guardian. Such member may not vote or serve as a Director.
 3. FAMILY MEMBERSHIP: For any husband, wife and children (natural, adopted, step or foster) eighteen years of age and under or any combination thereof. The family is entitled to two votes on any issue before the membership. Must list husband and wife names for voting privileges, plus names and birthdates of youth.
 4. ORGANIZATIONAL MEMBERSHIP: Any organization (i.e. corporation, partnership, farm, syndicate, enterprise or any group of one or more persons or groups) not using all of their names individually shall be eligible to vote on any issue or to serve as a Director/Trustee of the Ohio Paint Horse Club by virtue of said Organizational Membership.
 - C. Memberships expire December 31 of each year.
6. BOARD OF TRUSTEES: The Board of Trustees shall consist of eleven persons, four of which are the Officers of the Club, six of which are voting Directors, and the Past President is retained as a Director

with voting rights until their successor goes out of office. Directors shall serve for one year; three Directors next elected shall serve for two years. Therefore every year at the Annual Meeting, three new Directors will be elected by the members and go to the bottom of the list. All six Directors, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Past President shall have equal votes. The President shall cast a ballot in case of a tie vote. Each Director shall be a bona fide resident of the area. No more than two members of any family or firm may sit on the Board of Trustees. Persons elected to the Board of Trustees shall pay their dues before taking office. No member shall hold office without being at least nineteen years of age as of January 1 of the year of election. No member shall serve on the Board of Trustees without being a member of the APHA.

7. OFFICERS

- A. The officers of this Club shall consist of a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer to be elected by the members at the Annual Meeting for a term of one (1) year. Persons receiving highest member votes will be elected (see article VI for election process).
- B. Any Officer or Director missing three (3) consecutive meetings will be relieved of their office by the Board of Trustees. Phone attendance and email attendance shall not count in lieu of physical attendance.
- C. Any elected open office in the Club created by any reason will be filled by an appointment by the President until it can be filled by election at the next General Membership Meeting for the unexpired term of that office.

8. DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS

- A. **PRESIDENT:** The President shall perform all duties incident to such office, preside at all meetings and perform such other and further duties as may, from time to time, be required of the President by the Directors, cast ballot in case of tie vote and appoint special committees.
- B. **VICE PRESIDENT:** The Vice President shall perform all duties of the President in case of the latter's absence or disability.
- C. **SECRETARY:** The Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all transactions of the Members and Trustees and shall give all notices required by law and Code of Regulations or By-Laws of the Club. The Secretary shall keep a proper book and records of the club affairs and at the expiration of the term of Office shall deliver all books, papers and property of the Club to the President or their successor.
- D. **TREASURER:** To receive and safely keep all monies and securities of the Club and to keep account and records of the finances which shall be open to inspection by Club members at all times and to perform all other duties incident thereto. All expenditures exceeding \$300.00, except for actual horse show expenses, shall be approved by the Trustees in a meeting before payment is ordered. The Treasurer of the Club will be bonded for the mutual protection of the Club and Treasurer. The Treasurer shall prepare a complete financial statement to be presented to the membership at the Annual Meeting. The annual financial report will be distributed to all members and/or published in the membership newsletter.
- E. **RECORDS:** Records and materials compiled and maintained pursuant to the completion of OPHC business are the property of the OPHC. This includes, but is not limited to, the records of officers, committee chairperson, futurity chairperson, point keeper, membership secretary, awards and donations. Upon the completion of his/her tenure, each guardian will be required to surrender the records to the OPHC President or his/her designee.

9. ELECTION

- A. The President shall appoint a nominating committee at least sixty (60) days prior to the Annual Meeting of the election of officers.
- B. All voting for Officers and Directors shall be by personal ballot.
- C. Nomination may be made by a nominating committee and by nomination from the floor. Any person can be nominated who is a member in good standing of the OPHC at least (60) days before and must have previously consented to such nomination.
- D. Each Officer or Director shall be nominated, voted upon and election completed before nomination can be accepted for the next office.
- E. Membership closes sixty (60) days before the election.

10. ORDER OF BUSINESS: Robert's Rules of Order shall prevail at all meetings:
 - A. Call to Order
 - B. Roll Call of Membership
 - C. Election of Officers and Directors
 - D. Reading of Minutes of Previous Meeting
 - E. Treasurer's Report
 - F. Communications and Notices
 - G. Reading of Reports and Statements
 - H. Unfinished Business
 - I. New or Miscellaneous Business
 - J. Adjournment

11. SUSPENSION AND EXPULSION OF MEMBERS: Any member may be suspended or expelled by the Trustees for failure to pay dues or for conduct unbecoming a member. Before any member is suspended or expelled, written notice of the charges against him/her and the time and place of the meeting of the Trustees at which the same are to be considered, shall be mailed to him/her at their address as it appears in the record of the corporation, at least thirty (30) days before such meeting; and he/she shall be given an opportunity to defend, and shall have the right to appeal from the decision of the Trustees to the members, and upon their written request the Secretary shall call a special meeting of the members to consider such appeal. National suspension carries Ohio Paint Horse Club suspension automatically.

12. AMENDMENTS: The Board of Trustees shall have the power and authority to make, amend, repeal and enforce such rules and regulations, not contrary to law or the Certificate of Incorporation or these By-Laws, as they may deem necessary with expedience concerning the conduct, management, and activities of the Club, the admission, classification, qualification, suspension and expulsion and removal of money, the auditing of books and records, the conducting of shows, contests, exhibitions, races, sales and social functions and other details relating to the general purposes of the club, all however, subject to revision or amendment by the members, provided written notice of intention by any member to move the revision or specified amendment of any rule or regulation shall have been mailed to the President by September 15th prior to the annual meeting. These regulations may be amended, supplemented or repealed by written assent thereto at any Trustees monthly meeting provided all Trustees have been notified in writing of such desire to amend said regulation. Three fourths ($\frac{3}{4}$) of the Trustees must be present at said meeting with two thirds ($\frac{2}{3}$) majority vote to change said regulations. Any member in good standing may propose an amendment to the By-Laws by submitting the proposed amendment in writing to the executive committee through the business office. The amendment will become effective only upon written ballot by the Board of Directors. The OPHC Board reserves the right to interpret, amend and enforce all rules. Any decision or interpretation made by the Board shall be final.

13. INDEMNIFICATION: Each Director, Officer and Committee person of said Club shall be indemnified by the Club against all cost, expense, and liabilities reasonably incurred by him/her in connection with/or resulting from any action, suit or proceeding to which he/she may be made a party by reason of his/her being or having been a Director, Officer or Committee person of the Club, except in relation to matters which shall have been occasioned by the willful misconduct or dishonesty of such Officer, Director or Committee person. The foregoing right of indemnification shall cover amounts paid in settlement of any such action, suit or proceeding when such settlement appears to be in interest of the Club. The foregoing right shall be in addition to any other right to which such Director, Officer or Committee person may be entitled as a matter of law.

14. The OPHC and co-sponsoring organizations, if any, shall not be responsible for any personal injury, or for loss or damage to property, occurring at any OPHC activity. Each owner, exhibitor, handler, or consignor shall indemnify and hold harmless the OPHC, its officers, directors, and employees from and against all claims, demands, causes of action, and expenses of every kind, including attorney's fees, arising out of or related in any manner to the acts or omissions of an owner, exhibitor, handler or consignor or the actions of any animal under the card, custody, or control of the owner, exhibitor,

handler or consignor. Presentation of signed entry or consignment forms shall be deemed acceptance of the conditions of this rule. In the event an entry or consignment form is not signed or presented, appearance on the grounds or at the sale ring of any OPHC activity as an exhibitor, handler, owner or consignor shall be deemed to be acceptance of the conditions of this rule.

15. DISSOLUTION: Upon dissolution of the corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all the assets of the corporation exclusively for the purposes of the corporation in such manner, or to such organizations or organizations organized and operated exclusively for agricultural purposes as shall at the time qualify as exempt organization or organizations under Section 501.C(5) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue Law, the Board of Directors shall determine. The American Paint Horse Association, Fort Worth, Texas, is to be given first consideration.
16. STANDING COMMITTEES: The President shall appoint standing committees as needed.
17. All affiliated OPHC Clubs ie: *OPHC Youth Club and OPHC Amateur Club* must submit minutes and attendance of all meetings to the OPHC Secretary. A financial statement must be submitted on a quarterly basis or upon request of the OPHC Directors. All affiliated OPHC Club bank accounts shall have the OPHC Treasurer as a signor on the account.
18. In Any Conflict Between the Constitution of the Club and the Rules and By-laws of the American Paint Horse Association (APHA), those of the APHA will govern.

OHIO PAINT HORSE YOUTH CLUB BY-LAWS

PURPOSE: To create, stimulate and promote interest in the breeding, riding and showing of the Paint Horse for the Youth of the State of Ohio. To, at all times, promote the upgrading of the Paint Horse to improve the breed in this State. To promote and hold horse shows, participate in horse shows, hold trail rides and other activities, to promote and create interest with the Youth towards the Paint Horse and to do any and all things necessary or incident to the accomplishment of such purposes.

CODE OF REGULATIONS

1. MEETINGS
 - A. GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETINGS: Meetings of the organization shall be held at such time and place as agreed upon by a majority of the members. Notice of the same shall be sent to all members by the Secretary.
 - B. EXECUTIVE MEETINGS: Meetings of the Officers shall be held at the discretion of the President or Vice President.
 - C. NOTICE OF MEETINGS: Notice of special and monthly meetings shall be given to the members by the Secretary either by mail or telephone, whichever is appropriate at least ten (10) days before such meetings.
 - D. SPECIAL MEETINGS: Special meetings may be called by the President, Vice President, Youth Advisor or by a majority of the members.
2. MEMBERSHIP AND DUES: Any youth eighteen (18) years of age and under, having a bona fide interest in Paint Horses may apply for membership. Any youth who pays membership dues to the Ohio Paint Horse Club will automatically become a member of the Ohio Paint Horse Youth Club.
3. OFFICERS
 - A. The Officers of the Club shall consist of a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer to be elected by a majority vote of the members present at the last General Membership Meeting of each calendar year for a term of one (1) year.
 - B. Youth Advisor(s) shall be selected by a majority vote of the members present at the last General Membership Meeting of each calendar Year. This selection will be subject to approval by the Directors of the Ohio Paint Horse Club.
4. DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS
 - A. PRESIDENT: The President shall perform all duties incident to such office, preside at all meetings, and perform such other and further duties as may from time to time arise, cast ballot in case of tie vote and appoint special committees.
 - B. VICE PRESIDENT: The Vice President shall perform all the duties of the President in case of the President's absence or disability.
 - C. SECRETARY: The Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all transactions of the members and shall give all notices required by law and Code of Regulations or By-Laws of the Club. They shall keep a proper book and record of membership and at the expiration of his/her term of office shall deliver all books, papers and property of the Club to the President or their successor.
 - D. TREASURER: The Treasurer shall receive and safely keep all monies and securities of the Club and to keep account and records of the finances which shall be open to inspection by club members at all times and to perform all other duties incident thereto. All checks must be signed by two (2) officers, being either the President, Vice President or Treasurer, whose names and signatures will appear on the signature cards held at the financial institution where funds are kept. The OPHC Treasurer's name and signature will be required on the signature card held at the financial institution where funds are kept. The Treasurer shall submit quarterly reports and yearly reports to the membership and OPHC Treasurer, and submit the financial records to the OPHC Treasurer for an annual audit. The OPHC Treasurer shall receive the bank statements from the bank and a copy forwarded to the Youth Treasurer. All expenditures exceeding \$150.00 for the actual running expenses of the Club shall be approved by the OPHC Board of Directors before payment is ordered. An exception shall be the expenses incurred for the Youth Club sponsored horse show(s) and Year End Awards which the Club sponsors. These expenses may be paid without approval of the OPHC as long as they are kept within the figure of the previous year.
5. ELECTION: All voting for Officers and Youth Advisor(s) shall be by ballot. Nominations may be made by a nominating committee or by nomination from the floor. Any person nominated must have previously consented to such nomination. Each officer shall be nominated, voted upon and election completed before nominations can

be accepted for the next office.

7. SUSPENSION AND EXPULSION OF MEMBERS: Any members may be suspended or expelled by the membership for failure to pay dues or for conduct unbecoming of a member. Before any member is suspended or expelled, written notice of the charges against him/her and of the time and place of the meeting of the membership at which the same are to be considered, shall be mailed to him/her at his/her address as it appears in the records of the corporation, at least thirty (30) days prior to such meeting. He/she shall be given an opportunity to defend and shall have the right to appeal from the decision of the membership and upon his/her written request the Secretary shall call a special meeting of the members to consider such appeal.

8. AMENDMENTS: These regulations may be amended, supplemented or repealed by the written assent thereto at any membership meeting provided all members have been notified of such desire to amend said regulations.

The Ohio Paint Horse Club Board of Directors voted and approved the amendments on Feb. 17, 2007.

OHIO PAINT HORSE AMATEUR CLUB BY-LAWS

PURPOSE: To create, stimulate, and promote interest in the breeding, riding and showing of the Paint Horse for the Amateurs of the State of Ohio. To, at all times, promote the upgrading of the Paint Horse to improve the breed in the State. To promote and hold horse shows, participate in horse shows, hold trail rides and other activities, to promote and create interest with the Amateurs towards the Paint Horse and to do any and all things necessary or incidental to the accomplishment of such purposes.

CODE OF REGULATIONS

1. MEETINGS

- A. GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING: Meetings of this organization shall be held at such time and place as agreed upon by a majority of the members. Notice of the same shall be sent to all members by the OPHC Newsletter. A minimum of four meetings shall be held each year.
- B. EXECUTIVE MEETINGS: Meetings of the Officers shall be held at the discretion of the President and Vice President.
- C. SPECIAL MEETINGS: Special meetings may be called by the President, Vice President or by a majority of the members.

2. MEMBERSHIP AND DUES

- A. Any Amateur who pays membership dues to the Ohio Paint Horse Club, and who is over eighteen (18) years old and having a bona fide interest in the Paint Horse will automatically become a member of the Ohio Paint Horse Amateur Club.
- B. Amateurs MUST hold an APHA Amateur and/or Novice Amateur card for the current year to be eligible for OPHAC membership.

3. OFFICERS: The Officers of this Club shall consist of a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer to be elected by a majority vote of the members present at the last General Membership Meeting of each calendar year for a term of one (1) year. The Past President will be retained as an Officer until their successor goes out of office.

4. DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS

- A. PRESIDENT: The President shall perform all duties incident to such office, preside at all meetings, and perform such duties when the time arises, cast ballot in case of tie vote and appoint special committees.
- B. VICE PRESIDENT: The Vice President shall perform all the duties of the President in case of the latter's absence or disability.
- C. SECRETARY: The Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all transactions of the members and shall give all notices required by law and Code of Regulations or By-Laws of the Club. The Secretary shall keep a proper book and record of membership and at the expiration of his/her term of office shall deliver all books, paper and property of the Club to the President or their successor.
- D. TREASURER: The Treasurer shall receive and safely keep all monies and securities of the club and keep account and records of the finances which shall be open to inspection by club members at all times and to perform all other duties incident thereof. The OPHC Treasurer shall receive the bank statements from the bank and a copy forwarded to the Amateur Treasurer.

5. ELECTION: All voting for officers shall be by ballot. Nominations may be made by nominating committee or by nominations from the floor. Any person nominated must hold an APHA amateur card and have previously consented to such nomination. Each officer shall be nominated, voted upon and election completed before nominations can be accepted for the next office.

7. SUSPENSION AND EXPULSION OF MEMBERS: Any member suspended or expelled from the Ohio Paint Horse Club and/or APHA is automatically suspended or expelled from the OPHAC.
8. AMENDMENTS: These Regulations may be amended, supplemented or replaced by the written assent thereto at any membership meeting provided all members have been notified in writing of such desire to amend said regulations.

OHIO PAINT HORSE CLUB AWARDS SYSTEM

- 1 In order to be eligible to receive points and awards in the OPHC, the/all owner(s) must hold membership in the OPHC. In addition, the exhibitor of the horse must also hold membership in the OPHC. The owner is the person(s) or organization(s) whose name last appears on the horse's registration papers. In the case of an organization, it must also be a member of the OPHC for the horse to be eligible for points, even if some or all of the members of the organization may individually be members of the OPHC. In order to receive state points and awards, paid OPHC membership must be received prior to showing in any class. (Points earned prior to payment of dues will not accumulate in total year-end points.) The winner of any award must be a member in good standing at the end of the point year.
- 2 A \$25.00 fee will be charged for each non-sufficient funds (NSF) check not paid within 30 days of the date of the first notice from the Treasurer. Check must be re-paid with certified funds. After 30 days, the fees for each check will be \$50.00. The member will be on cash *only basis until further notice as decided by the Board*. No Ohio points will be awarded for the show for which the check was written and no points will be awarded for any shows thereafter unless the funds are received within the above stated 30 days. If you fail to pay within the 30 days, all points earned from the date the check was written will be permanently lost. Points will begin accruing only from the date that back funds are paid.
- 3 Any and all shows in the state of Ohio approved by both APHA and sponsored or co-sponsored by OPHC (including Youth & Amateur Clubs) will be eligible for Ohio Paint Horse Club points. Shows being considered for outside organizations, excluding OPHC Youth and Amateur Clubs and Ohio State Fair, must complete, sign and submit the OPHC Show Application Form, \$100.00 application fee, and completed show bill to OPHC the earlier of ninety (90) days or March 1 of each calendar year prior to the proposed show date requesting their show be approved for OPHC state points. A membership in the Ohio Paint Horse Club, Inc. must be held in the name of the person(s), organization or club that is making the OPHC show application. The completed show bill must be presented by the applicant and included with the application. The bottom of the show bill shall state: "*The Ohio Paint Horse Club, Inc, it's officers and directors will not be responsible for loss, injury, or theft of any kind at this particular function. In order to be eligible to receive points and awards in the Ohio Paint Horse Club, Inc., the/all owner(s) must hold membership in the Ohio Paint Horse Club, Inc. The person actually exhibiting the horse must also hold a membership in the OPHC (Rule #1, OPHC Awards System, 2004 OPHC Rule Book). All OPHC and APHA rules and regulations must be followed.*" Shows sponsored by an outside organization must send a copy of their proof of insurance including the Liability Declarations page listing the complete name and address of insured as listed on the show application. The OPHC requires Limits of Liability on Liability Declarations will be \$2,000,000 General Aggregate and \$1,000,000 each occurrence. An additional Certificate of Insured Endorsement in the same name as the show application naming the Ohio Paint Horse Club, Inc. as additionally insured is required within thirty (30) days after show approval. Show sponsor(s) must provide the following within ten (10) days following the show: 1-Show results to the OPHC Point Chairperson in the form of a legible and complete copy of the APHA Show Roster, along with copies of each judges' cards for each class offered, and show assessment fees of \$2.00 per horse per judge (number of horses that appears on the APHA Roster to APHA will be used). A copy of the letter or e-mails from APHA regarding any corrections to this show must also be forwarded to the OPHC Point Chairperson. 2-OPHC Memberships (forms and fees) taken at the show must be forwarded to the OPHC Membership Chairperson. It is the responsibility of the applicant to have OPHC Membership forms available. The show applicant must purchase back numbers from the OPHC at the price of \$1.00 per set of two numbers to prevent duplication of numbers in our points system. This amount must be paid upon approval of the show. (Fill-in form on reverse side of application.)
- 4 The results of any approved show must be completed in their entirety on official forms furnished by the OPHC listing the first seven (7) horses, unless fewer than that number competed. These forms should be forwarded to the Point Secretary within ten (10) days after completion of the show.
- 5 To be eligible for OPHC Year End Awards in any class (i.e. Sr. Western Pleasure) the horse or horse/rider combination must participate in 10 classes (of that same class—ie. Sr. Western Pleasure), of which five (5) must be at non-Paint-O-Rama shows. If a class is offered fewer than ten (10) times, the horse or horse and rider combination must show in five (5) classes to be eligible. To be eligible for Weanling Year End Awards, horse must show at a minimum of 3 shows and under 6 judges at non-Paint O Rama or Zone O Rama shows .
- 6 All points are to be awarded on the placing. The system is as follows: For a class of six (6) or more horses in halter or performance, the first place horse receives six (6) points, the second place five (5) points, etc. The first place horse gets no more points than were in that class. The Grand Champion will receive two (2) more points than the largest class in their sex division. The Reserve Champion will receive one (1) more point than the largest class in their sex division. This is regardless of whether the Grand or Reserve were in the largest class. No OPHC approved show may award more than one set of points per judge.
- 7 The OPHC shall give an award to the Halter Horse accumulating the most halter points in each sex division.
- 8 The OPHC shall give an award to the All Around Horse of the Year. To be eligible, a horse must have received

- at least ten (10) points in the Halter Division, at least ten (10) points in each of two (2) different performance categories (defined in the APHA rule book, rule SC-190). The number of Halter Points must match the number of Performance Points per category above the minimum. Amateur and Youth Points will not count in these Year End Awards.
- 9 The OPHC shall give an award to the High Point Performance Horse. To be eligible, a horse must have received at least five (5) points in a minimum of four (4) different performance classes. The four (4) different performance classes are to be in a minimum of at least two (2) different categories (defined in the APHA rule book, rule SC-050). Amateur and Youth Points will not count in these Year End Awards.
 - 10 The OPHC shall give an award to the Stallion, Mare and Gelding accumulating the most overall total points. Points will include halter and/or performance. Amateur and Youth Points will not count in these Year End Awards.
 - 11 Points shall not count in Futurity or Stakes Classes.
 - 12 Any member that has been suspended by APHA shall also be suspended from the OPHC (see ByLaws #11).
 - 13 All High Point Awards are to be of the same quality (monetary) for Champion. Reserve Awards are to be of the same quality (monetary) also. The All Around Horse and High Point Performance and High Point Overall Stallion, Mare and Gelding shall receive a more distinguishing award than the High Point Halter Horse.
 - 14 The OPHC shall give an award to the horse accumulating the most points in speed classes. To be eligible for this award the horse must have a minimum of ten (10) points in two (2) different speed events.
 - 15 For the rotating Memorial Awards, there will also be an engraved plaque given by the OPHC for the recipient to keep.
 - 16 Any special award(s) given out at the Awards Banquet by an individual or organization will not be given until all qualifications to win said award are published in the OPHC newsletter or OPHC rule book and the Board will not approve any special awards until these qualifications to win said awards are presented.
 - 17 Final Year-End points tabulations are to be audited by Committee at least once prior to the Awards Banquet (~November 1st) by the Vice President and Membership Chair.
 - 18 The OPHC shall give a **Bob Snyder Memorial Award** to the regular registry horse earning the highest overall points in Open Halter for the year.
 - 19 The OPHC shall give a **Glenn Bennett Memorial Award** to the year end Overall Open High Point Regular Registry Halter Mare.
 - 20 The OPHC Board reserves the right to interpret, amend and enforce all rules. Any decision or interpretation made by the Board shall be final.

PAC (Paint Alternative Competition) RECOGNITION

The Ohio Paint Horse Club (OPHC) will recognize the Regular Registry and/or Solid paint bred Paint Horses in competition outside of the approved APHA and OPHC shows as long as the event and/or class is recognized as an APHA—PAC event. OPHC will not keep record of credits earned, but will provide recognition of the horse that is highest in credits for the State of Ohio through APHA. See the APHA Rule Book for rules in the Paint Alternative Competition.

OPHC YOUTH AWARDS SYSTEM

- 1 The system of points shall be the same as the OPHC.
- 2 To qualify for youth points in the State of Ohio a horse must be owned or leased by the youth and/or youth's family (mother, father, brother, sister, aunt, uncle, legal guardian, or grandparent), family owned corporation, ranch or farm (APHA Rule YP-015). To qualify for OPHC youth points in Ohio when the horse does not meet ownership requirements, an OPHC lease form must be on file with the Points & Awards Chairperson. A lease form must be obtained, completed, signed by two (2) Directors and given to the Points Chairperson before any points will be counted. A lease form can be found elsewhere in this rule book.
- 3 Points will go with the one horse/one rider combination except for Lead Line. No lease is needed and points will follow the rider, but an OPHC member must own the horse.
- 4 Points count for any youth classes held at an Ohio Paint Horse Club show or club approved show.
- 5 There will be a year end high point and reserve high point award given by OPHC in Walk –Trot (5-9), Novice Youth, 13 & under, 14-18, and Solid Paint Bred Youth 18& under years of age divisions.
- 6 OPHC will also award a grand and reserve in each youth class. Combined youth age classes will be split into 13 & under and 14-18 divisions for awards, except Halter where the split will be for Junior & Senior horses.
- 7 **The rules for the Youth Team competition shall be determined *at the November Membership meeting by the Youth Club Members.***
- 8 There will be a High Point All Around Youth Trophy awarded. This is the **Carolyn Williams Memorial**. This award is given to the youth with the highest number of youth points. To qualify for this award the youth/horse combination must have 10 state youth halter points, plus 10 state youth performance points in each of three of the six categories as defined in APHA Rule YP-025. In case of a tie, the Youth with the most firsts, etc. shall receive this trophy. There will be an appropriate award given by OPHC that the recipient may keep as well as a rotating trophy that must be returned to the Awards & Points Chairperson forty-five (45) days prior to the Awards Banquet for engraving the following year's recipient. The return of this trophy will be the complete responsibility of the recipient.
9. There will be a High Point Youth Showmanship Trophy awarded. This is the **JULIE SIMS MEMORIAL TROPHY**. This is awarded to the youth/horse combination accumulating the most pints in youth showmanship (13 & under or 14-18 youth showmanship classes). For a Walk-Trot (11 & Under) youth to be eligible for this award, they must show in the 13& under age division. In case of a tie, the youth with the most firsts, etc. shall be awarded the trophy. There will be an appropriate award given by OPHC that the recipient may keep as well as a rotation trophy that must be returned to the Points & Awards Chairperson forty-five (45) days prior to the awards banquet for engraving the following year's recipient. The return of this trophy will be the complete responsibility of the recipient.
10. There will be a high point Youth Western Pleasure trophy awarded. This is the **MIKE ANDERSON MEMORIAL TROPHY**. This trophy is awarded to the Youth/horse combination accumulating the highest number of points overall in the Youth Western Pleasure (13 & Under or 14-18 western pleasure classes). In case of a tie, the youth with the most firsts, etc. shall receive this trophy. There will be an appropriate award given by OPHC that the recipient may keep as well as a rotating trophy that must be returned to the Awards & Points Chairperson forty-five (45) days prior to the Awards Banquet for engraving the following year's recipient. The return of this trophy will be the complete responsibility of the recipient.
11. Five awards will be presented to the top five (5) All Around Youth by the OPHYC. These awards are given to the youth with the highest number of youth points (13 & under or 14-18 classes). To qualify for these awards a youth/horse must have ten (10) youth state halter points, plus ten (10) youth state performance points in each of *two (2)* of the six (6) categories as defined in APHA Rule YP-025.
12. An award will be presented to the Top 2 all around Walk-Trot horse/rider by OPHYC. These awards are to be given to the Youth with the highest combined number of points in Walk-Trot and Youth Halter classes. To qualify for these awards, the youth/horse combination must have at least 10 state points in youth halter, at least 10 points in performance (Walk-Trot Western Pleasure, Walk-Trot Horsemanship, Walk-Trot Hunter Under Saddle, Walk-Trot English Equitation) and at least 10 points in Walk-Trot Trail.
13. An award will be presented to the High Point Youth Performance Horse by OPHYC. This award is given to the Youth horse combination that has accumulated the most youth state performance points (13 & under or 14-18 classes). To qualify for this award a youth/horse combination must compete in two (2) classes in three (3) of the six (6) categories, as defined in APHA Rule YP-025 and must also have at least five (5) state points in each class for a total of ten (10) state points in the category.
14. A sportsmanship award will be awarded in each age division: Walk-Trot (5-9years), 13& under and 14-18. This award is determined by popular vote of the members of the OPHC Youth Club. This is a rotating award and must be returned to the Awards & Points Chairperson forty-five (45) days prior to the Awards Banquet for

engraving the following year's recipients. The return of these trophies will be the complete responsibility of the recipients.

Rules for World Show Youth Team Tournament

1. You must turn in a letter of intent, signed by you and your parents to the youth advisors by the end of the youth show in April.
2. You must turn in the following by the end of the P-O-R show the following weekend: List of classes in order of preference in which you would like to participate; Your placings in those classes at as many OPHC shows as there are up to APHA deadline; A copy of your horses registration papers; Your name and APHA Youth number.
3. Youth advisor will determine who will show in what classes according to the most points earned in as many OPHC shows as there are up to the APHA deadline.
4. You must be a member of OPHC.
5. A time will be designated by which you must check in with a designated person at the World Show. If you have not, someone else will be substituted in your classes.
6. OPHYC will pay the entry. Other financial help will be discussed after our Youth Show.

Classes included in the Team Tournament are Showmanship, Leadline, Walk-Trot, Hunter Under Saddle, Horsemanship, Western Pleasure, Reining and Barrels.

Rules for World Show Youth Judging Team

1. You must turn in a letter of intent, signed by you and your parents to the youth advisors by the end of the youth show in April.
2. Youth advisor will make any decisions, if needed, about who can participate according to experience.
3. OPHYC will pay entry fees for a maximum of two teams. Each team consists of 4 members and an alternate. Any other financial support will be decided after the youth show.
4. You must be a member of OPHC.

If you make a commitment to do one of these activities, please do everything you can to participate. These entries must be made by May 15 and cannot be changed or substituted.

OPHC AMATEUR AWARDS SYSTEM

- 1 The system of points shall be the same as the Ohio Paint Horse Club.
- 2 To qualify for Year End Awards in the State of Ohio, a horse must be owned by the amateur, the amateur's family, spouse, mother, father, son, daughter, brother, sister, grandchild, legal ward, in-laws (father, mother, brother or sister) or family owned corporation, ranch or farm.
- 3 Points will be compiled on a one rider/one horse combination.
- 4 Points will count for any approved OPHC show offering amateur classes.
- 5 Five (5) awards will be presented to the top five high point amateurs showing regular registry horses. All points will be combined from all amateur classes into one total, with the amateur having the largest total being first, next largest total second, etc. for a one horse/one rider combination. Three (3) awards will be presented to the top three high point novice amateurs (one horse/one rider combination) showing regular registry horses following the same format above. Only novice classes will be totaled for the top three (3) novice awards. Two (2) awards will be presented to the top two overall high point amateurs showing solid paint bred registered horses.
- 6 To be eligible for OPHC Amateur Year End Awards, the horse and rider combination must participate in ten (10) classes of which five (5) must be at single judge (non-Paint-O-Rama) shows. If a class is offered fewer than ten (10) times, the horse and rider combination must show in five (5) classes to be eligible.
- 7 There will be a High Point Amateur Western Pleasure Rotating Trophy and an Overall High Point Amateur Rotating Trophy. This is the **Jennifer A. Fedorek Memorial Trophy and the Ron Fille Memorial Trophy**. Rules for winning these trophies are: This trophy will be awarded to the high point amateur western pleasure team at the end of each show year and **the Ron Fille Memorial Trophy will be awarded to the Overall High Point Amateur.** These trophies will be awarded at the annual awards banquet for the Ohio Paint Horse Club.
 - A. To be eligible for this award, the amateur must be in good standing and hold an amateur card from the APHA. The horse must be owned by the amateur or other parties as outlined in the APHA rule book. The award will be presented only to a team consisting of one rider/one horse.
 - B. The amateur rider/horse team must have exhibited as a team in at least ten (10) OPHC approved amateur western pleasure classes. Paint-O-Ramas, as always, will count as separate shows per judge (refer to the OPHC awards system rules). If the number of approved shows fall below fifteen (15) in a given year, this number will be altered to the team having to show in at least one-half (½) of the approved classes.
 - C. Ties will be broken, since this is a single revolving trophy. These methods will be used to break ties: 1-The team with the most firsts, 2-The team with the most seconds, 3-A flip of the coin with all parties present.
 - D. The trophy must be returned to the custodian at least forty-five (45) days prior to the year end awards banquet. The return of the trophy will be the complete responsibility of the recipient. This time will allow for sufficient time for engraving for the new winner's name and to allow time for engraving a plaque, which will be presented to the previous year's winner, prior to the presenting of the trophy to the current year's winner.
 - E. The maintenance of the trophy, engraving of each year's winner, and the cost and engraving of the plaque presented to the prior year's winner will be paid by an escrow account set up by and managed through the custodian. However, damage to the trophy due to neglect or abuse on the part of the recipient should be borne by the recipient, and failure to do so will result in the barring of that amateur from eligibility of the high point trophy in future years. Although the trophy is maintained by a separate custodian, as long as the award shall be given, the authority to make any changes, additions or amendments to these guidelines shall be given to the OPHC, Amateur Division, through a majority vote.
 - F. These memorial trophies are for the highest point earning regular registry one amateur rider/one horse combination in Amateur Western Pleasure class **and the High Point Overall Amateur.**
- 8 A Sportsmanship Award will be presented for the current year and will be voted on at the General Membership Meeting of that year.
- 9 The Ohio Paint Horse Amateur Club will award the #1 Amateur and #1 Novice Amateur with a rotating trophy. This trophy will be awarded annually at the year end awards banquet to the highest point earning one rider/one horse combination in the Amateur division and Novice Amateur division. The trophy must be returned to the custodian at the Fall General Membership meeting prior to the year end awards banquet. The return of the trophy will be the complete responsibility of the recipient.
- 10 A Gist Award certificate will be awarded for the #1 Amateur and the #1 Novice Amateur providing there are sufficient funds.

(In any conflict between the constitution of the Club and the Rules & By-Laws of the APHA, those of APHA will govern)

OHIO BRED OHIO SHOWN FUTURITY AKA O.B.O.S. FUTURITY

1. The Stallion must be Ohio owned or at least one of the owners must reside in Ohio.
2. The Mare must be owned or leased by an Ohio resident. (If leased, a lease agreement must be signed and sent to the Futurity Chairperson.
2. All owners and/ or part owners and leasee must be members in good standing of the Ohio Paint Horse Club at time of futurity entry. OPHC dues must be paid by a separate check mailed to the membership chairperson, not included with the entry.
3. Futurity Chairperson must be notified in writing of ownership transfer. New owner must be an Ohio resident and a member of the Ohio Paint Horse Club by show date.
4. If the new owner is a resident of another state, foal or entry(s) becomes ineligible.
5. All showmen must be paid members of the Ohio Paint Horse Club by show date.
6. Showmen: Must meet the following relationship criteria: Self, Spouse, Mother, Father, Son, Daughter, Brother, Sister, Aunt, Uncle, Step-Child, Half-Brother, Half-Sister, Grandparent, Grandchild, Legal Ward, In-laws, Legal Guardian, Family Owned Corporation, Ranch or Farm. APHA Rule AM 020 & YP 015
7. Futurity Classes are: Weanling Paint Colts, Weanling Solid Paint Bred Colts, Weanling Paint Fillies, Weanling Solid Paint Bred Fillies, Yearling Paint Colts & Geldings, Yearling Solid Paint Bred Colts and Geldings, Yearling Paint Fillies, Yearling Solid Paint Bred Fillies, Yearling Paint Longeline and Yearling Solid Paint Bred Longeline.
8. One payment of \$45.00 is due and postmarked by August 5th of the current year.
9. Late penalty payment of \$25.00 will be taken until 7:00 p.m. the day before the show (regular payment of \$45.00 + penalty payment of \$25.00 = \$70.00 total late payment).
10. Copy of Yearling Registration Papers must be forwarded along with the entry form to Chairperson.
11. Weanlings may show without papers, but prize money will be withheld until written proof (copy of APHA Registration Papers, or a copy of the letter of intent to register from the APHA Office) of registration has been supplied to Futurity Chairperson, PRIOR TO JANUARY 1st of the Yearling Year. The winnings will be held with the letter of intent from APHA or if an inspection by APHA is necessary until APRIL 1st of the Yearling Year.
12. Entry fees for this Futurity are not co-mingled with any other funds of the Ohio Paint Horse Club.
13. 10% of the entry fees are to be used for futurity expenses.
14. Late penalty payments will be added to appropriate division.
15. Prize Money:

17. All checks will be mailed to winners within thirty (30) days after the show, providing written proof of registration (copy of registration papers) has been furnished to Futurity Chairperson. After January 1st of the yearling year, if proof in form of registration papers or the letter of intent from APHA with the APHA Work Number on it has not been forwarded to the Futurity Chairperson or if the Ohio Paint Horse Club memberships of all Owners and Showmen (refer to above Rules 3,5,6 & 7), money will be forfeited and redistributed. Only exception is Rule 12.
18. There will be no refunds or substitutions of any kind issued by the Ohio Paint Horse Club for any reason.
19. Four judge system will be used. Placing will be tabulated using the point system whereby all four judges' placings are counted with equal value, however, in case of a tie, ties will not be broken. Any added money will be divided according to the total number of horses shown.
20. It is the responsibility of the owners of horses entered in this OPHC sponsored futurity to be sure all payments are made in full and on time. This includes all memberships to OPHC. The OPHC, its Officers, Directors and Chairpersons will not be responsible for any missed payments and/or unpaid memberships. The OPHC Board reserves the right to interpret, amend and enforce all rules. Any decision or interpretation made by the Board shall be final.

O.P.H.C. HALTER FUTURITY

1. All owner(s) and exhibitor(s) or showmen must be members in good standing of the Ohio Paint Horse Club at the time of show and hold a current membership in the Ohio Paint Horse Club. OPHC membership dues must be paid by a separate check mailed to the membership chairperson and not be included with the entry.
2. Futurity Chairperson must be notified in writing of ownership transfer. New owner(s) must join the Ohio Paint Horse Club by show date.
3. All yearling and two year olds must have registration papers or a letter from the National Office in hand in order to show. Copies of Registration Papers must be forwarded to the Chairperson with the entry.
4. Weanlings may show without papers, but prize money will be withheld until written proof (copy of APHA Registration Papers or a copy of the letter of intent to register from APHA Office) of registration has been supplied to Futurity Chairperson PRIOR TO JANUARY 1ST of the Yearling Year. The winnings will be held with the letter of intent from APHA or if an inspection by APHA is necessary until APRIL 1ST of the Yearling Yr., or forfeited and redistributed thereafter.
5. All owner(s) and exhibitor(s) in electing to enter the OPHC Halter Futurity agree as a condition of entry to allow drug testing of their horses and automatic disqualification of horses and forfeiture of all awards for refusal to have the test or a positive result of said drug test or illegal practice. APHA rules will prevail.
6. Weanling Division will be shown in two sections, a filly section and a colt (stallion or gelding) section. Each section will be divided into Junior Paint, Senior Paint, *Junior Solid Paint Bred and Senior Solid Paint Bred* and Non-Pro Junior Paint and Non-Pro Senior Paint Classes. Divisions will be determined by dividing the total number of entries so the actual birth dates are very important. All foals where birth dates were not given will automatically be placed in the Senior Section.
7. Regular registry paint foals and solid paint bred foals are eligible to show.
8. A Champion Weanling Filly will be named from the two (2) winners of the Junior and Senior regular paint registry filly divisions. A Champion Weanling Colt will be named from the two (2) winners of the Junior and Senior regular registry colt divisions.
9. Yearling division will include halter and longe line. Yearlings must be nominated as weanling by January 31st of the year they were born to be eligible.
10. Two year old *regular registry paint* division will be shown in halter only. Please notify the Chairperson if stallion has been gelded. Two year olds must have been nominated as weanlings by January 31st of the year they were born to be eligible.
11. Rules governing Produce of Dam and Get of Sire. Only paid up eligible Futurity horses may show. (\$25.00) Twenty five dollar entry fee payable before the start of the first OPHC Halter Futurity Class, the day of the show. Combined ownership of entries are allowed.
12. First payment of \$15.00 per class must be postmarked by January 31st of the current year. A second payment of \$30.00 per class must be postmarked by August 5th of the current year. All yearlings and two year olds on which the first nomination payment has been made as a weanling, are eligible for nomination in the yearling and two year old divisions. If all missed payments are made plus a late payment of \$5.00 for every month late (late payment also applies to sustaining payment of weanlings. A late payment will be accepted (except on weanlings where the first payment due January 31st of weanling year was not made, but must be paid and postmarked by August 15th of the current year. No exceptions!!! For Non Pro Classes, a \$45.00 payment shall be due August 5th. Non Pro exhibitors must be a youth or produce an APHA Amateur Card for the current year. A copy of Amateur card must be included with the August 5th entry and payment. Eligible foals must have been nominated by January 31st for the OPHC Halter Futurity.
13. If a first payment on a weanling is paid on January 31st and the second payment is not paid and the Chairperson does not receive back the information on the sex, color, birth date, then the first payment money will be divided equally between all the weanling divisions.
14. If there are late penalty payments, they will be added to the appropriate divisions, this would then give the total class purse to be divided, with added money.
15. Fifteen percent (15%) of the nomination fee (first payment only) to be used for futurity expenses.
16. Entry fees and nomination fees for the OPHC Halter Futurity are deposited upon receipt into a trust account and are not commingled with other funds of the Ohio Paint Horse Club. This trust account is not subject to any use other than the payment of awards in accordance with payoff rules for the events of which the fees were tendered by exhibitors.
17. The OPHC cannot be held responsible for entries which are not received by their respective deadlines.
18. Judging will be at the Labor Day Weekend Paint-O-Rama show.
19. Four judge system will be used. Placing will be tabulated using the point system whereby all four judges' placings are counted with equal value; however, in case of a tie, ties will not be broken. Any added money will be divided according to the total number of horses shown.
20. Paid up horses are eligible, but not required, to compete at the futurity show.

21. Yearling regular registry Stallions, Mares and Geldings and Two year old Stallions, Mares and Geldings will be held concurrently with the corresponding APHA Open class, therefore the owner or exhibitor must enter the corresponding APHA Open Class.

First payments for 2WP or 2HUS will not be broken down for Walk-Trot or Walk, Trot, Lope class. At time of 2nd payment, designate which class you wish to enter, otherwise you will automatically be placed in the Walk, Trot, Lope class. The 2WTP & 2WTH will be open to Solid Bred Paints. Both regular registry and solid paint bred are eligible for all other classes.**

1. All owners and exhibitors must be paid members of the OPHC by show date. If not a member, send membership fees with your performance stakes entry, but write separate checks for each.
2. All owners and exhibitors agree as a condition of entry to allow drug testing of their horses and automatic disqualification of horses and forfeiture of all awards for refusal to have the test or a positive result of said drug test or illegal practice. APHA rules will prevail.
3. Futurity Chairperson must be notified in writing of ownership transfer. New owners must join OPHC by show date.
4. Non Pro entrants must carry an APHA Amateur card or be a Youth 18 years of age or younger. A copy of the Amateur Card must be forwarded with the entry.
5. Paid up horses are eligible but not required to compete at the Performance Stakes.
6. Walk/Trot Classes are for 2 year olds that **have not shown** in any lope or canter classes prior to and including the OPHC Futurity Show. Walk/Trot horses cannot show in a lope or canter class.
7. **LATE FEES:** If you miss the June 1 payment deadline, you may still enter by August 5 by paying double the first payment plus a \$50.00 late penalty (\$110.00) plus the second payment (total \$155.00).
8. If you met the June 1st payment deadline and missed the August 5th payment, you may still enter by August 15th by paying double the second payment, plus a \$50.00 late penalty (total \$140.00).
9. If you missed both the June 1st and August 5th deadlines, you may still enter by August 15th by paying double the first payment plus \$50.00 late penalty (\$110.00), double the second payment plus a \$50.00 late penalty (\$140.00) = total \$250.
10. Late penalty payments will be added to the appropriate division as added money to the class.

17. **Super Horse Award:** The award will be a sterling silver, custom designed, hand engraved belt buckle. To qualify for this award a horse must be entered, all payments made, and shown in four categories (WP, HUS, Reining & Barrels). There will be no extra entry fee for this award and multiple riders (who meet OPHC membership requirements) will be eligible for each horse. The winner will be the horse with the most points accumulated in the four categories. Points will be tabulated from each of the four judges. For a class of six or more horses, the first place horse will receive six points, the second place will receive five points, etc. Ties will be broken by: 1. Horse with most first places, 2. O.P.H.C. STALLION SERVICE AUCTION (SSA)

Rules, Terms & Conditions As Amended and restated November 20,2004 & December 29, 2008

Section 1.00 - AUCTION TERMS & CONDITIONS

- 1.01 Bidding will start at one-half (1/2) the stud fee or \$250.00, whichever is greater. Stud fee must be the usual, advertised fee. If advertised at private treaty, stallion owner retains the right to stipulate the starting bid, which shall be treated for the purpose of this auction as 50% of the stallion fee.
- 1.02 All bids must be paid in full the day of the sale unless other arrangements have been made with auction chairperson prior to sale.
- 1.03 Service must be used in the year donated and purchased.
- 1.04 Mares are not to be bred prior to payment of bid in full. Stallion owners will be notified of purchaser's name, address and telephone number by the Stallion Service Auction (SSA) Chairperson. If an "insufficient funds" check is received, the mare will not be bred until the purchase amount is made good within 15 days of NSF notice. If check is not made good, the purchase will be considered null and void and the stallion service put on the list of remaining, available services.
- 1.05 Mare owners may purchase stallion services that have not been sold at the auction for 50% of the advertised/stated stud fee if purchased prior to February 15 of the current year of the auction. After February 15 a mare owner may purchase any remaining unsold stallion services at 60% of the advertised/stated stallion fee until June 1 of the current year of the auction.
- 1.06 All funds collected from the stallion services sold and stay fees shall be held in trust, except as provided in section 2.12, by the Ohio Paint Horse Club (OPHC) until such time as the required distributions under the SSA Rules herein. The funds shall be allocated as follows: 10% to OPHC, 40% to Weanling SSA Futurities, 25% to Yearling SSA Futurities, and 25% to SSA Two Year Old Futurities
- 1.07 Mares must be broke to halter and lead and be in sound breeding condition. All monies for mare care, chute fees, and veterinary (if needed) are to be collected by and paid to the stallion owner. Donating stallion owners shall indicate on their donation forms the amount of the mare care, chute fees or other charges to be paid for by the mare owner. The OPHC shall not be responsible for disputes between the Stallion Owner and Mare Owner.
- 1.08 The stallion service auction breeding contract shall be the only binding contract pertaining to this breeding. Both the Stallion and Mare Owner agree to abide by the terms set forth in the contract.
- 1.09 Stallion owner agrees to diligently try to settle mare, administer proper care of mare if at their facility, and guarantee a breeders certificate for APHA papers (regular or solid paint bred) for live foals born. A copy of stallion's papers must accompany their SSA contract.
- 1.10 The stallion owner/agent has the option to bring pictures of his stallion, get and/or facilities to the auction to help promote stallion services.
- 1.11 Neither the OPHC nor the auction facility shall be responsible or assume liability in the case of accident, injury or illness to stallion or mare at any time.
- 1.12 No stallion service consignments will be accepted after the day of the sale.
- 1.13 There shall be NO REFUNDS under any circumstances.
- 1.14 Any mare owner purchasing a service must be a current member of the OPHC.
- 1.15 In the case of death of the stallion or should stallion become unfit for breeding purposes prior to fulfilling the SSA service (by written veterinary statement), mare owner may apply payment toward a remaining unsold service in the current year, apply payment toward the purchase of a service the following year, or forfeit purchase. No refunds will be given.
- 1.16 The OPHC Board reserves the right to interpret, amend and enforce all rules. Any decision or interpretation made by the Board shall be final.
- 1.17 Stallion services may not be resold.

OPHC STALLION SERVICE FUTURITY (SSA)

RULES, TERMS & CONDITIONS AS AMENDED AND RESTATED DECEMBER 29, 2007

- 2.01 In order for a foal to be eligible for the SSA Futurities, it must be the offspring of the stallion service sold in this auction.
- 2.02 In order for the foal to be eligible the sire or dam must be registered with the APHA, APSHA or the APOHA. All foals must be registered with the APHA. Solid paint bred are eligible for all SSA classes.
- 2.03 There shall be a maximum of a one year carry-over of eligibility if a stallion owner guarantees a live foal and the mare bred does not produce a foal in the year following the purchase of the stallion service. The mare owner shall be responsible for notifying the SSA Chairperson in writing, postmarked no later than August 5th of the year following the purchase of stallion service that the mare owner elects to carry-over eligibility under this section.
- 2.04 In order for a foal to be eligible, the owner(s) must be a member(s) in good standing.
- 2.05 Stallion owner is limited to providing one service per stallion sold. The sale of the stallion service makes the stallion owner and the purchaser eligible to show one (1) foal each in the futurity out of a mare he/she owns or leases. A leased mare is defined as one with an APHA lease form filed before the breeding of the mare. Those stallions not selling have an option to pay a \$100 stay fee by August 5th postmark of the current year to retain their foal's eligibility. A stallion owner is entitled to a maximum of one entry per stallion sold and may carry over eligibility for one year even if the stallion owner's mare does not produce a foal in the year of eligibility.
- 2.06 **One free entry fee will be given and can be used as a weanling, yearling or two year old class. Must notify SSA Futurity Chair which class the one time free entry fee will be used.**
- 2.07 The Weanling Division will be shown in 4 halter classes - Jr Colts, Sr Colts, Jr Fillies and Sr Fillies. Junior and Senior classes will be split based on the median birthdate of all entries. When an odd number of foals are nominated, the junior class shall be the larger. The weanling eligible for the futurity must be nominated to the SSA Futurity Chairperson postmarked no later than August 5th of the eligible weanling year. This rule applies to both the mare owner who purchased the stallion service as well as the stallion owner's entry. *A late penalty of \$100 paid to the OPHC as an administrative expense, may be made until 24 hours prior to the class in addition to the entry. The late penalty shall not be added to the purse.*
- 2.08 All Weanlings showing for purse money must have a nomination form filled out by August 5th of year showing. Before purse money is distributed, a copy of registration papers must be received for any SSA entry by April 1st the following year, after which it will be forfeited and redistributed.
- 2.09 All Weanlings not showing in the Weanling Futurity, but wish to remain eligible for the Yearling and/or 2 year old Futurities must be nominated by December 31st of their Weanling year to SSA Futurity Chairperson. Once a weanling is nominated, no substitutions can be made under any circumstances.
- 2.10 The Yearling Division will be shown in 4 classes - Halter Fillies, Colts, Geldings, and Longe Line. Only those yearlings eligible and nominated in the previous year can be shown with a one-time entry fee of \$35 per class entered (Halter \$35, Longe Line \$35). Yearling Longe Line Class shall be run according to APHA rules in effect at the time of the show. A copy of registration papers must accompany this fee. Payment is due postmarked by August 5th of the year of the show to the SSA Futurity Chairperson. A late penalty of \$50 paid to the OPHC as an administrative expense, may be made until 24 hours prior to the class in addition to the above stated entry fee. The late penalty shall not be added to the purse.
- 2.11 Owner is responsible to be sure all payments are made on time. The OPHC, its officers, directors, and chairpersons will not be held responsible for any missed payments and unpaid memberships.
- 2.12 Changes in ownership do not change eligibility of foal, provided new owner is a member of the OPHC by the show date. Notify chairperson of any changes in ownership.
- 2.13 The following is a division of the purses (the same sliding scale as the OPHC Futurity):

- The purse is divided by the total number of foals/horses exhibited per age division (amount per foal/horse) and is then multiplied by the number of foals/horses in each class to determine the amount to be distributed in each class.
- 2.14 Ten percent (10%) of the total purse collected from the auction, as well as any interest accrued on any accounts, as well as late fees, shall be paid to the OPHC to subsidize trophies, auction, advertising and show expenses, etc. at a time designated by the Board of Directors.
- 2.15 Forty percent (40%) of the total purse collected from the SSA will be placed in the Weanling Halter Futurity split between the junior and senior colts and fillies (4 classes) as described in § 2.12.
- 2.16 Twenty-five percent of the total purse will be placed in the Yearling SSA Futurity split between Halter Colts, Halter Fillies, Halter Geldings and Yearling Longe Line classes (§ 2.12).

Section 3.00 - 2 YR OLD WESTERN PLEASURE & HUNTER UNDER SADDLE

- 3.01 The OPHC SSA Snaffle Bit Futurity shall consist of Western Pleasure & Hunter Under Saddle classes.
- 3.02 Twenty-five percent (25%) of the total purse will be placed in the Snaffle Bit Futurity, split between Western and English classes using the procedure in § 2.12.
- 3.03 Foals eligible and nominated in the previous Yearling SSA Halter division may show in one or both current year Snaffle Bit classes. Solid paint bred are eligible.
- 3.04 Horses must have been nominated as weanlings, but did not have to be shown in the Weanling or Yearling divisions to be eligible.
- 3.05 Proof of eligibility to be made with a copy of registration papers. They will be checked with a list of foals declared by stallion owners and mare owners. Copy of registration papers must accompany entry.
- 3.06 A one time entry fee of \$35 per class paid in one payment. Payment is due postmarked by August 5th of the year of the show to the SSA Futurity Chairperson. A late penalty of \$50, paid to OPHC as an administrative expense, may be made until 24 hours prior to the class in addition to the above stated entry fee. The late penalty shall not be added to the purse.
- 3.07 It is the responsibility of the owners of horses entered in the SSA Futurity to be sure payments are made in full and on time. The OPHC, its officers, directors and chairpersons will not be responsible for any missed payments and unpaid memberships.
- 3.08 Transfer of ownership does not change eligibility. Futurity Chairperson must be notified of transfer. All owners must be members of OPHC.
- 3.09 Classes shall run according to APHA 2 year old Western Pleasure and Hunter Under Saddle classes in effect at the time of the show, and entries may be subject to drug testing.

O.P.H.C. RECREATIONAL RIDING PROGRAM

This program is designated to promote members and their Regular Registry and Solid Paint Bred Paint Horses, who ride or drive for recreation and leisure purposes by providing and promoting trail rides in the State of Ohio.

1. All ride participants and their vehicles must be registered by completing the OPHC Trail Ride contract with a signed liability release waiver.
2. Chairpersons, Co-Chairpersons, Management/Grounds Owners, where you are riding and the Ohio Paint Horse Club reserve the right to qualify each rider's ability and to excuse any rider from activities beyond their skill level for safety purposes.
3. All riders under 18 must be accompanied by a parent, legal guardian or chaperone in camp and on the ride. No minors may be left in camp unattended. Location will determine rider's minimum age.
4. Alcoholic beverages are not allowed on the trail.
5. A Trail Boss or Pace Setter will be assigned, all riders must stay behind the trail boss or pace setter.
6. No rough riding or racing is permitted.
7. Stallions are not permitted.
8. Dogs and other pets are not permitted on the trail. In camp, pets must be contained or on a leash at all times.
9. No riding double.
10. No motorized vehicles (ATV's, motorbikes, scooters, golf carts) or bicycles allowed on the trail.
11. Riders must be able to ride without the assistance of others.
12. To warn other riders, a horse prone to kicking must have a red ribbon tied at the top of its tail.
13. In accordance with the Ohio State Department of Agriculture, no out of state horse will be allowed on the premises without the following:
 - A. Health Certificate issued no earlier than 10 days by a licensed veterinarian from the horse's state of origin.
 - B. Negative Coggins (test for Equine Infectious Anemia) - Dated no earlier than 6 months. Ask your veterinarian for the required health documentation for your horse to travel to Ohio from your state.
 - C. Only healthy horses will be allowed on premises.
14. No smoking while riding on the trail. Smoking allowed in designated areas only.
15. No ponied or loose horses allowed on ride except as approved by Management.
16. No firearms.
17. No fireworks.
18. In case of emergency, immediately contact the Chairperson, Co-Chairpersons, Trail Boss or Pace Setter.
19. The rules for the grounds that has been contracted with (ie:Metropolitan, State of Ohio, US National Parks, etc.) will also be in affect. If they are different than our rules, written notification will be given to you at the time you sign the OPHC Trail Ride Agreement and the liability release waiver.
20. The Ohio Paint Horse Club, Inc., it's Officers and Directors or the contracted grounds will not be responsible for loss, injury, damage to property or theft of any kind.
